## FRAME Project Partners Join Explore Research Network

The FRAME project partners from Laos and Thailand received a preparatory grant of around \$15,000 to develop a research proposal on community participation in Forest Landscape Restoration (FLR) in the region.

The research aims to identify and understand barriers and opportunities for FLR governance in the watershed forests of Laos and Thailand. The project is part of the RECOFTC's EXPLORE research network, which supports universities in Southeast Asia and strengthens the capacity of researchers by developing a research network and community of practice dedicated to expanding and applying knowledge on FLR governance.

The expected results will help FLR in upstream watershed forests and the livelihood of local people. The project will also contribute to several of the ERASMUS+ FRAME project's core objectives.
